We have all asked many questions since the Las Vegas shooting. One of the most important questions I have been asked repeatedly is, “How can I help change things?”

First —contact your federal legislators and tell them to be change makers by doing the following:

- Reject bills such as US [H.R. 3668](#), the SHARE Act, that would remove long-standing regulations on silencers and loosen restrictions on armor piercing bullets. Some of you have already notified your representatives about this bill—remind them.
- Reject bills such as US [H.R. 38](#), the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act that would require states to honor the concealed carry weapons permits of every other state, regardless of how the other states address safety.
- Fund robust independent, non-partisan data gathering, research, and analysis on gun injuries and deaths. Solutions start with information.
- Enact [universal background checks](#) for firearm purchases.
- Regulate firearms and related items in a smart and flexible way to maintain the safety of law enforcement and the general public. Regulations must account for changes in technology and use.
